Following Specific Appropriation 96, DELETE:

From the funds in Specific Appropriation 96, \$31,716,373 in nonrecurring funds is provided for the Science of Reading Literacy and Tutoring Program. These funds are to be used to provide additional reading literacy support to students in kindergarten through grade 5 enrolled in a public school who either scored below Level 3 on the final English Language Arts (ELA) assessment in the prior year or who the district has determined through progress monitoring to be below grade level and in need of additional reading intervention.

AND INSERT:

From the funds in Specific Appropriation 96, \$31,466,373 in nonrecurring funds is provided for the Science of Reading Literacy and Tutoring Program. These funds are to be used to provide additional

reading literacy support to students in kindergarten through grade 5 enrolled in a public school who either scored below Level 3 on the final English Language Arts (ELA) assessment in the prior year or who the district has determined through progress monitoring to be below grade level and in need of additional reading intervention.

From the funds provided in Specific Appropriations 96, \$250,000 in nonrecurring funds are provided to the Department of Education to competitively procure bleeding control kits and to provide them to school districts for placement in all schools statewide. Each district shall ensure bleeding control kits are available in each school.

Line item amendments are accepted as part of the amendatory process. However, due to the necessity of using computerized systems this may entail a different placement within a budget entity or the renumbering of the specific appropriation items.
