33	(2) A livery may not offer a vessel for lease or rent	
34	without first being issued a no-cost livery permit by the	
35	commission. The permit must be renewed annually. To qualify for	
36	issuance or renewal of a livery permit, an applicant must	
37	provide the commission with a list of all vessels offered by the	
38	livery for lease or rent by another, have valid insurance	
39	pursuant to subsection (8) (7), have an amount of United States	
40	Coast Guard-approved lawful personal floatation devices on site	
41	sufficient to accommodate the capacity of all vessels offered by	
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the livery for rent or lease by another, have on site all safety 42 equipment required by s. 327.50 and the Code of Federal 43 44 Regulations sufficient to equip all vessels offered by the livery for rent or lease by another, and display the information 45 46 required by paragraph (3)(f). If, before the annual renewal of 47 the permit, the information required by this subsection changes, 48 the livery must provide the commission with the updated information within 10 days after the change. 49

50 (a) The commission may adopt rules to implement this51 subsection.

(b) A person who violates this subsection commits a
misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as provided in s.
775.082 or s. 775.083.

55 (3) A livery may not knowingly lease or rent a vessel to 56 any person:

57 (e) Unless the livery provides <u>hands-on</u> pre-rental or pre-58 ride instruction in compliance with rules established by the 59 commission.

62 a. Operational characteristics of the vessel to be rented.63 b. Safe vessel operation and vessel right-of-way.

95	rent any livery vessel unless the livery first :	
96	1. Obtains and carries in full force and effect a policy	
97	from a licensed insurance carrier in this state which insures	
98	the livery and the renter against any accident, loss, injury,	
99	property damage, or other casualty caused by or resulting from	
100	the operation of the livery vessel. The insurance policy must	
101	provide coverage of at least \$500,000 per person and \$1 million	
102	per event. The livery shall have proof of such insurance	
103	available for inspection at the location where livery vessels	
104	are being leased or rented, or offered for lease or rent, and	
105	shall provide to each renter the insurance carrier's name and	
106	address and the insurance policy number; and	
107	2. Either:	
108	a. Obtains and carries in full force and effect a policy	
109	from a licensed insurance carrier in this state which insures	
110	the renter in the same manner and amounts of the policy obtained	
111	by the livery under subparagraph 1. and provides to each renter	
112	the insurance carrier's name and address and the insurance	
113	policy number; or	
114	b. Presents the renter with the opportunity to purchase	
115	liability coverage which insures the renter against any	
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116	accident, loss, injury, property damage, or other casualty
117	caused by or resulting from the operation of the livery vessel
118	of at least \$50,000 per person and \$100,000 per event. If a
119	renter chooses not to purchase the insurance, the livery must
120	obtain a signed acknowledgement from the renter which includes
121	the following statement:

123	I understand that I am refusing to purchase a vessel
124	rental insurance policy for coverage of at least
125	\$50,000 per person and \$100,000 per event for any
126	damage or injuries caused directly or indirectly by my
127	operation of the vessel.

129	The rental insurance policy coverage is being offered

133	I understand that I may not have other insurance to
134	cover any damage or injuries caused directly or
135	indirectly by my operation of the vessel and that I
136	may be personally liable for any such damage or
137	injuries during the rental period.

139	This section does not apply to human-powered vessels.
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140 (9)(8) Notwithstanding the person's age or any exemptions 141 provided in s. 327.395, any person delivering instruction 142 regarding the safe operation of vessels or <u>hands-on</u> pre-rental 143 or pre-ride instruction in accordance with subsection (3) must 144 have successfully completed a boating safety education course 145 approved by the National Association of State Boating Law 146 Administrators and this state.

327.731 Mandatory education for violators.-

(1) A person convicted of a criminal violation under this chapter, convicted of a noncriminal infraction under this chapter if the infraction resulted in a reportable boating accident, or convicted of <u>a</u> two noncriminal <u>infraction</u> infractions as specified in s. 327.73(1)(h)-(k), (m), (o), (p), and (s)-(y), the infractions occurring within a 12-month period, must:

(a) Enroll in, attend, and successfully complete, at his or her own expense, a classroom or online boating safety course that is approved by and meets the minimum standards established by commission rule;

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164 File with the commission within 90 days proof of (b) 165 successful completion of the course; and 166 (c) Refrain from operating a vessel until he or she has filed proof of successful completion of the course with the 167 168 commission.; and 169 (2) (d) A person convicted of a criminal violation under 170 this chapter, convicted of a noncriminal infraction under this chapter if the infraction resulted in a reportable boating 171 172 accident, or convicted of two noncriminal infractions as specified in s. 327.73(1)(h) - (k), (m), (o), (p), and (s) - (y), 173 the infractions occurring within a 12-month period, must pay a 174 fine of \$500.
