19	(2) In order to facilitate efficient emergency responses,
20	the School Mapping Data Grant Program is created within the
21	Department of Education. Each school district, in consultation
22	with local law enforcement and public safety agencies, may apply
23	to receive funds from the program to provide school mapping data
24	for each public school, including charter schools, in the
25	district. The school district shall use the funds to satisfy all

26 or some of the requirements of this section, which may include 27 procuring a vendor to provide such data. The entity producing 28 the data is responsible for providing the data to the school 29 district and local law enforcement and public safety agencies 30 for use in response to emergencies and for conducting drills required under s. 1006.07(4). 31 32 (a) School mapping data must be provided in an electronic 33 or a digital format to assist first responders in responding to 34 emergencies at schools. 35 (b) The school mapping data provided must: 36 1. Be compatible with software platforms used by local, 37 state, and federal public safety agencies that provide emergency 38 services to the specific school for which the data is provided 39 without requiring such agencies to purchase additional software 40 or requiring a fee to view or access the data. 41 2. Be compatible with security software platforms in use 42 by the specific school for which the data is provided without 43 requiring the local law enforcement agencies or school districts 44 to purchase additional software or requiring a fee to view or 45 access the data. 3. Be in a printable format and, if requested in addition 46 47 to paragraph (a), be in a digital file format that can be 48 integrated into interactive mobile platforms in use. 49 4. Be verified for accuracy by a walk-through of school 50 buildings and grounds.

51 5. Be oriented true north. 52 6. Be overlaid on current aerial imagery. 53 7. Contain site-specific labeling that matches the 54 structure of school buildings, including room labels, hallway 55 names, and external door or stairwell numbers and locations of 56 hazards, critical utility locations, key boxes, automated 57 external defibrillators, and trauma kits. 58 8. Contain site-specific labeling that matches the school grounds, including parking areas, athletic fields, surrounding 59 60 roads, and neighboring properties. 61 9. Be overlaid with gridded x and y coordinates. 62 Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2023.
