131 Section 2. Section 893.131, Florida Statutes, is created
 132 to read:

133 893.131 Distribution of controlled substances resulting in
 134 overdose or serious bodily injury.—

135 (1) As used in this section, the term:

136 (a) "Distribute" has the same meaning as in s. 893.02, and
 137 includes the direct or indirect delivery of a controlled
 138 substance to a user.

139 (b) "Emergency opioid antagonist" has the same meaning as
 140 in s. 381.887(1).

141 (c) "Medical care" means the administration of treatment
 142 for the purposes of preserving or sustaining life or the
 143 administration of an emergency opioid antagonist.

144 (d) "Overdose or serious bodily injury" means drug
 145 toxicity or a physical condition that creates a substantial risk
 146 of death or substantial loss or impairment of the function of
 147 any bodily member or organ.

148 (e) "Substantial factor" means that the use of a substance
 149 or mixture alone is sufficient to cause an overdose or serious
 150 bodily injury, regardless of whether any other substance or

151 mixture used is also sufficient to cause an overdose or serious
152 bodily injury.

153 (2) (a) Except as provided in paragraph (b), a person 18
154 years of age or older who unlawfully distributes:

155 1. Heroin, as described in s. 893.03(1)(b)11.;

156 2. Alfentanil, as described in s. 893.03(2)(b)1.;

157 3. Carfentanil, as described in s. 893.03(2)(b)6.;

158 4. Fentanyl, as described in s. 893.03(2)(b)9.;

159 5. Sufentanil, as described in s. 893.03(2)(b)30.;

160 6. Fentanyl derivatives, as described in s.

162 7. A controlled substance analog, as described in s.

177 (3) The administration of medical care by an emergency
 178 responder, including, but not limited to, a law enforcement
 179 officer, a paramedic, or an emergency medical technician is
 180 prima facie evidence that the person receiving medical care
 181 experienced an overdose or serious bodily injury.

182 (4) A person who experiences, or has a good faith belief
 183 that he or she is experiencing, an alcohol-related or a drug-
 184 related overdose and receives medical assistance, or a person
 185 acting in good faith who seeks medical assistance for an
 186 individual experiencing, or believed to be experiencing, an
 187 alcohol-related or a drug-related overdose, is afforded the
 188 protections provided under s. 893.21.
