28 (4) Any unit owner may display one portable, removable
 29 United States flag in a respectful way and, on Armed Forces Day,
 30 Memorial Day, Flag Day, Independence Day, Patriot Day, and
 31 Veterans Day, may display in a respectful way portable,
 32 removable official flags, not larger than 4 1/2 feet by 6 feet,
 33 that represent the United States Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine
 34 Corps, Space Force, or Coast Guard, regardless of any
 35 declaration rules or requirements dealing with flags or
 36 decorations.

37 Section 2. Paragraphs (a) and (b) of subsection (2) of
 38 section 720.304, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

39 720.304 Right of owners to peaceably assemble; display of

41 (2)(a) If any covenant, restriction, bylaw, rule, or
 42 requirement of an association prohibits a homeowner from
 43 displaying flags permitted under this paragraph, the ~~Any~~
 44 homeowner may still display ~~one portable, removable United~~
 45 ~~States flag or official flag of the State of Florida~~ in a
 46 respectful manner up to two of the following, ~~and one portable,~~
 47 removable flags ~~official flag, in a respectful manner,~~ not
 48 larger than 4 1/2 feet by 6 feet: ~~which represents~~

- 50 2. The official flag of the State of Florida.

51 3. A flag that represents the United States Army, Navy,
 52 Air Force, Marine Corps, Space Force, or Coast Guard.~~, or~~

54 5. A first responder flag. A first responder flag may
 55 incorporate the design of any other flag permitted under this
 56 paragraph to form a combined flag. For purposes of this
 57 subsection, the term "first responder flag" means a flag that
 58 recognizes and honors the service of any of the following:

59 a. Law enforcement officers as defined in s. 943.10(1).

60 b. Firefighters as defined in s. 112.191(1).

61 c. Paramedics or emergency medical technicians as those
 62 terms are defined in s. 112.1911(1).

63 d. Correctional officers as defined in s. 943.10(2).

64 e. 911 public safety telecommunicators as defined in s.
 65 401.465(1).

66 f. Advanced practice registered nurses, licensed practical
 67 nurses, or registered nurses as those terms are defined in s.
 68 464.003.

69 g. Persons participating in a statewide urban search and
 70 rescue program developed by the Division of Emergency Management
 71 under s. 252.35.

72 h. Federal law enforcement officers as defined in 18
 73 U.S.C. s. 115(c)(1), ~~regardless of any covenants, restrictions,~~
 74 ~~bylaws, rules, or requirements of the association.~~

75 (b) Regardless of any covenants, restrictions, bylaws,

76 rules, or requirements of the association, a ~~Any~~ homeowner may
 77 erect a freestanding flagpole no more than 20 feet high on any
 78 portion of the homeowner's real property as long as, ~~regardless~~
 79 ~~of any covenants, restrictions, bylaws, rules, or requirements~~
 80 ~~of the association, if~~ the flagpole does not obstruct sightlines
 81 at intersections and is not erected within or upon an easement.
 82 The homeowner may further display in a respectful manner from
 83 that flagpole, ~~regardless of any covenants, restrictions,~~
 84 ~~bylaws, rules, or requirements of the association,~~ one official
 85 United States flag, not larger than 4 1/2 feet by 6 feet, and
 86 may additionally display one other official flag permitted under
 87 paragraph (a) of the State of Florida or the United States Army,
 88 ~~Navy, Air Force, Marines, Space Force, or Coast Guard, or a POW-~~
 89 ~~MIA flag.~~ Such additional flag must be equal in size to or
 90 smaller than the United States flag. The flagpole and display
 91 are subject to all building codes, zoning setbacks, and other
 92 applicable governmental regulations, including, but not limited
 93 to, noise and lighting ordinances in the county or municipality
 94 in which the flagpole is erected and all setback and locational
 95 criteria contained in the governing documents.

96 Section 3. Section 720.3045, Florida Statutes, is created
 97 to read:

98 720.3045 Installation, display, and storage of items.—
 99 Regardless of any covenants, restrictions, bylaws, rules, or
 100 requirements of an association, and unless prohibited by general

101 law or local ordinance, an association may not restrict parcel
 102 owners or their tenants from installing, displaying, or storing
 103 any items on a parcel which are not visible from the parcel's
 104 frontage or an adjacent parcel, including, but not limited to,
 105 artificial turf, boats, flags, and recreational vehicles.

106 Section 4. Subsection (3) of section 720.3075, Florida
 107 Statutes, is amended to read:

108 720.3075 Prohibited clauses in association documents.—

109 (3) Homeowners' association documents, including
 110 declarations of covenants, articles of incorporation, or bylaws,
 111 may not preclude the display of up to two ~~one~~ portable,
 112 removable flags as described in s. 720.304(2)(a) United States
 113 ~~flag~~ by property owners. However, all flags ~~the flag~~ must be
 114 displayed in a respectful manner, consistent with the
 115 requirements for the United States flag under Title 36 U.S.C.
 116 chapter 10.

117 Section 5. This act shall take effect July 1, 2023.
