Section 1. Subsection (4) of section 718.113, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

- (4) Any unit owner may display one portable, removable United States flag in a respectful way and, on Armed Forces Day, Memorial Day, Flag Day, Independence Day, Patriot Day, and Veterans Day, may display in a respectful way portable, removable official flags, not larger than 4 1/2 feet by 6 feet, that represent the United States Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps, Space Force, or Coast Guard, regardless of any declaration rules or requirements dealing with flags or decorations.
- Section 2. Paragraphs (a) and (b) of subsection (2) of section 720.304, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:
- 720.304 Right of owners to peaceably assemble; display of flags flag; SLAPP suits prohibited.—
- (2) (a) If any covenant, restriction, bylaw, rule, or requirement of an association prohibits a homeowner from displaying flags permitted under this paragraph, the Any homeowner may still display one portable, removable United States flag or official flag of the State of Florida in a respectful manner up to two of the following, and one portable, removable flags official flag, in a respectful manner, not larger than 4 1/2 feet by 6 feet: which represents
 - 1. The United States flag.
 - 2. The official flag of the State of Florida.

rules, or requirements of the association, a Any homeowner may erect a freestanding flagpole no more than 20 feet high on any portion of the homeowner's real property as long as, regardless of any covenants, restrictions, bylaws, rules, or requirements of the association, if the flagpole does not obstruct sightlines at intersections and is not erected within or upon an easement. The homeowner may further display in a respectful manner from that flagpole, regardless of any covenants, restrictions, bylaws, rules, or requirements of the association, one official United States flag, not larger than 4 1/2 feet by 6 feet, and may additionally display one other official flag permitted under paragraph (a) of the State of Florida or the United States Army, Navy, Air Force, Marines, Space Force, or Coast Guard, or a POW-MIA flag. Such additional flag must be equal in size to or smaller than the United States flag. The flagpole and display are subject to all building codes, zoning setbacks, and other applicable governmental regulations, including, but not limited to, noise and lighting ordinances in the county or municipality in which the flagpole is erected and all setback and locational criteria contained in the governing documents.

Section 3. Section 720.3045, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

720.3045 Installation, display, and storage of items.—
Regardless of any covenants, restrictions, bylaws, rules, or
requirements of an association, and unless prohibited by general

law or local ordinance, an association may not restrict parcel

owners or their tenants from installing, displaying, or storing any items on a parcel which are not visible from the parcel's frontage or an adjacent parcel, including, but not limited to, artificial turf, boats, flags, and recreational vehicles.

Section 4. Subsection (3) of section 720.3075, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

720.3075 Prohibited clauses in association documents.—

(3) Homeowners' association documents, including declarations of covenants, articles of incorporation, or bylaws, may not preclude the display of up to two one portable, removable flags as described in s. 720.304(2)(a) United States flag by property owners. However, all flags the flag must be displayed in a respectful manner, consistent with the requirements for the United States flag under Title 36 U.S.C.

Section 5. This act shall take effect July 1, 2023.
