If an applicant does not hold a current certificate 23 issued by the National Commission on Certification of Physician 24 Assistants or its equivalent or successor organization and has 25 not actively practiced as a physician assistant within the 26 immediately preceding 4 years, the applicant must retake and 27 successfully complete the entry-level examination of the 28 National Commission on Certification of Physician Assistants or 29 its equivalent or successor organization to be eligible for 30 licensure.

4. Has completed the application form and remitted an
application fee not to exceed \$300 as set by the boards. An
application for licensure as a physician assistant must include:

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a. A diploma from an approved program.

b. Acknowledgment of any prior felony convictions.
