- (2) A cellular phone or any other mobile wireless communication device issued by a governmental agency to an employee of the agency as a condition of employment may not contain a covered application. The employee may not subsequently download the covered application onto the provided phone or device.
- (3) During a declared state of emergency, the Governor, or his or her designee, may use a covered application to broadcast information to residents of this state.
- (4) Law enforcement entities may use a covered application for any legitimate purpose that furthers the aims of such entities and protects the residents of this state.
- (5) The department may adopt rules to implement this section.
