59 (2) DEFINITIONS.—As used in this act, the term:

60 (a) "Critical infrastructure facility" means any of the  
61 following, if completely enclosed by a fence or other physical  
62 barrier that is obviously designed to exclude intruders, or if  
63 clearly marked with a sign or signs which indicate that entry is  
64 forbidden and which are posted on the property in a manner  
65 reasonably likely to come to the attention of intruders:

66 1. A power generation or transmission facility,

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- 67 substation, switching station, or electrical control center.
- 68 2. A chemical or rubber manufacturing or storage facility.
- 69 3. A water intake structure, water treatment facility,  
70 wastewater treatment plant, or pump station.
- 71 4. A mining facility.
- 72 5. A natural gas or compressed gas compressor station,  
73 storage facility, or natural gas or compressed gas pipeline.
- 74 6. A liquid natural gas or propane gas terminal or storage  
75 facility.
- 76 7. Any portion of an aboveground oil or gas pipeline.
