agencies and service providers.

- (5) Providing information concerning a petition for expunction of a criminal history record resulting from the arrest or filing of charges for an offense committed or reported to have been committed while the person was a victim of human trafficking which is filed pursuant to s. 943.0583.
- (6) Providing financial assistance for the cost of expunction of a criminal history record as provided in subsection (5).
- (7) Providing financial assistance for the cost of legal services to defend against criminal charges resulting from the arrest or filing of charges for an offense committed or reported to have been committed while the person was a victim of human trafficking.
- Section 2. This act shall take effect on the same date that HB 647 or similar legislation takes effect, if such legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes a law.
