69 (4) ADMINISTRATION.—An eligible nonprofit scholarship-70 funding organization participating in the Florida Tax Credit 71 Scholarship Program established by s. 1002.395 may establish 72 reading scholarship accounts for eligible students in accordance 73 with the requirements of eligible nonprofit scholarship-funding 74 organizations under this chapter.

(5) DEPARTMENT OBLIGATIONS.—The department shall have the same duties imposed by this chapter upon the department regarding oversight of scholarship programs administered by an eligible nonprofit scholarship-funding organization.

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(6) SCHOOL DISTRICT OBLIGATIONS; PARENTAL OPTIONS. -

80 (a) By September 30, the school district shall notify the
81 parent of each <u>eligible</u> student in kindergarten through grade 5
82 who has a substantial reading deficiency identified under s.
83 1008.25(5)(a) or scored below a level 3 on the statewide,
84 standardized ELA assessment in the prior school year of the
85 process to request and receive a reading scholarship, subject to
86 available funds.

(b) A school district may not prohibit instructional personnel from providing services pursuant to this section on the instructional personnel's school campus outside regular work hours, subject to school district policies for safety and

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91 security operations to protect students, instructional 92 personnel, and educational facilities.

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(7) ACCOUNT FUNDING AND PAYMENT.-

94 (a) The amount of the scholarship for an eligible student95 shall be as provided in the General Appropriations Act.

96 (b) One hundred percent of the funds appropriated for the 97 reading scholarship accounts shall be released to the department 98 at the beginning of the first quarter of each fiscal year.

99 (c) Upon notification from the eligible nonprofit 100 scholarship-funding organization that a student has been 101 determined eligible for a reading scholarship, the department 102 shall release the student's scholarship funds to such 103 organization to be deposited into the student's account.

(d) Accrued interest in the student's account is in addition to, and not part of, the awarded funds. Account funds include both the awarded funds and accrued interest.

107 The eligible nonprofit scholarship-funding (e) 108 organization may develop a system for payment of scholarship 109 funds by funds transfer, including, but not limited to, debit 110 cards, electronic payment cards, or any other means of payment 111 that the department deems to be commercially viable or costeffective. A student's scholarship award may not be reduced for 112 113 debit card or electronic payment fees. Commodities or services 114 related to the development of such a system shall be procured by

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115 competitive solicitation unless they are purchased from a state 116 term contract pursuant to s. 287.056.

(f) Payment of the scholarship shall be made by the eligible nonprofit scholarship-funding organization no less frequently than on a quarterly basis.

(g) Moneys received pursuant to this section do not constitute taxable income to the qualified student or his or her parent.

123 (h) A student's scholarship account must be closed and any 124 remaining funds shall revert to the state after:

125 1. Denial or revocation of scholarship eligibility by the 126 commissioner for fraud or abuse, including, but not limited to, 127 the student or student's parent accepting any payment, refund, 128 or rebate, in any manner, from a provider of any services 129 received pursuant to subsection (3); or

130 2. Three consecutive fiscal years in which an account has131 been inactive.

(8) LIABILITY.-No liability shall arise on the part of the state based on the award or use of a reading scholarship account.
