A return form that requires the registered voter to 21 admit or deny the accuracy of the information underlying the 22 potential ineligibility for purposes of a final determination by 23 the supervisor. <u>If the voter is reached by telephone, the</u> 24 <u>supervisor must offer to provide the voter with the form by mail</u> 25 or email.
