Section 1. Paragraph (d) of subsection (4) of section 119.071, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

119.071 General exemptions from inspection or copying of public records.—

(4) AGENCY PERSONNEL INFORMATION.—

(d)1. For purposes of this paragraph, the term:

a. "Home addresses" means the dwelling location at which an individual resides and includes the physical address, mailing address, street address, parcel identification number, plot identification number, legal property description, neighborhood

16 name and lot number, GPS coordinates, and any other descriptive
17 property information that may reveal the home address.

18 b. "Judicial assistant" means a court employee assigned to
19 a specific justice's or judge's office responsible for providing
20 administrative, secretarial, and clerical support to the

22 c. "Telephone numbers" includes home telephone numbers,
23 personal cellular telephone numbers, personal pager telephone
24 numbers, and telephone numbers associated with personal
25 communications devices.

26 2.a. The home addresses, telephone numbers, dates of
27 birth, and photographs of active or former sworn law enforcement
28 personnel or of active or former civilian personnel employed by
29 a law enforcement agency, including correctional and
30 correctional probation officers, personnel of the Department of

297 and the instrument number or Official Records book and page
298 number identifying the property with the exempt status from all
299 publicly available records maintained by the property appraiser
300 or tax collector. For written requests received on or before
301 July 1, 2021, a county property appraiser or county tax
302 collector must comply with this sub-subparagraph by October 1,
303 2021. A county property appraiser or county tax collector may

319 the custodial agency must release the specified information to
320 the party authorized to receive such information.

322 held by an agency before, on, or after the effective date of the
323 exemption.

324 7. Information made exempt under this paragraph may be
325 disclosed pursuant to s. 28.2221 to a title insurer authorized

357 number, or clerk's file number for each document containing the
358 information to be released. A fee may not be charged for the
359 release of any document pursuant to such request.

365 Section 2. The Legislature finds that it is a public
366 necessity that the home addresses, dates of birth, and telephone
367 numbers of current judicial assistants; the names, home
368 addresses, telephone numbers, dates of birth, and places of
369 employment of the spouses and children of such judicial
370 assistants; and the names and locations of schools and day care
371 facilities attended by the children of such judicial assistants
372 be made exempt from s. 119.07(1), Florida Statutes, and s.
373 24(a), Article I of the State Constitution. Such identifying and
374 location information can be used as a tool to perpetrate fraud
375 against an individual or to acquire sensitive personal,
376 financial, medical, and familial information, the release of
377 which could cause great financial harm to the individual. In the
378 course of assisting in reviewing cases, maintaining the court
379 docket, screening phone calls and visitors to a justice's or
380 judge's chambers, preparing orders, and coordinating and problem
381 solving with attorneys and litigants, judicial assistants may
382 incur the ill will of litigants, the accused, the convicted, and
383 their associates and families, thus making judicial assistants
384 and their spouses and children targets for acts of revenge. If
385 such identifying and location information is released, the
386 safety of current judicial assistants and their spouses and
387 children could be seriously jeopardized. For these reasons, the
