13	Section 1. Paragraph (b) of subsection (4) of section					
14	337.25, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:					
15	337.25 Acquisition, lease, and disposal of real and					
16	5 personal property					
17	(4) The department may convey, in the name of the state,					
18	any land, building, or other property, real or personal, which					
19	was acquired under subsection (1) and which the department has					
20	determined is not needed for the construction, operation, and					
21	maintenance of a transportation facility. When such a					
22	determination has been made, property may be disposed of through					
23	negotiations, sealed competitive bids, auctions, or any other					
24	means the department deems to be in its best interest, with due					
25	advertisement for property valued by the department at greater					
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26 than \$10,000. A sale may not occur at a price less than the 27 department's current estimate of value, except as provided in 28 paragraphs (a)-(d). The department may afford a right of first 29 refusal to the local government or other political subdivision 30 in the jurisdiction in which the parcel is situated, except in a conveyance transacted under paragraph (a), paragraph (c), or 31 32 paragraph (e). Notwithstanding any provision of this section to 33 the contrary, before any conveyance under this subsection may be 34 made, except a conveyance under paragraph (a) or paragraph (c), 35 the department shall first afford a right of first refusal to 36 the previous property owner for the department's current estimate of value of the property. The right of first refusal 37 must be made in writing and sent to the previous owner via 38 39 certified mail or hand delivery, effective upon receipt. The right of first refusal must provide the previous owner with a 40 41 minimum of 30 days to exercise the right in writing and must be sent to the originator of the offer by certified mail or hand 42 43 delivery, effective upon dispatch. If the previous owner exercises his or her right of first refusal, the previous owner 44 45 has a minimum of 90 days to close on the property. The right of 46 first refusal set forth in this subsection may not be required 47 for the disposal of property acquired more than 10 years before 48 the date of disposition by the department.

(b) If the property is to be used for a public purpose,
<u>including</u>, but not limited to, affordable housing as provided in

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51 <u>ss. 125.379 and 166.0451</u>, the property may be conveyed without 52 consideration to a governmental entity.

53 Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2023.

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
