1 House Resolution

A resolution designating March 2023 as "Colorectal Cancer Awareness Month" in Florida.

WHEREAS, colorectal cancer is currently the third-leading cause of cancer-related death in the United States among men and women, and

WHEREAS, in 2022, approximately 151,030 people were diagnosed with and approximately 52,580 people died from colorectal cancer in the United States, and

WHEREAS, the American Cancer Society estimates there will be 106,970 new cases of colon cancer and 46,050 new cases of rectal cancer in the United States in 2023, and

WHEREAS, according to the Department of Health, when adjusted for age, there were 10,702 colorectal cancer incidences per 100,000 Floridians in 2019, and

WHEREAS, regular screening, beginning at the age of 45, can discover colorectal cancer in its earlier stages and may increase colorectal cancer survival rates, and

WHEREAS, increasing awareness and education concerning colorectal cancer can lead to significant progress in preventing and overcoming the disease, as the majority of cases have proven to be treatable and survivable, and

WHEREAS, educational campaigns and efforts can provide information to the public on methods of prevention and screening
