1 House Resolution 2 A resolution recognizing September 15 to October 15, 3 2023, as "Latin and Hispanic Heritage Month" in 4 Florida. 5 6 WHEREAS, the national, month long celebration known as 7 "Hispanic Heritage Month" is dedicated to the culture, history, 8 and contributions of Latin American and Hispanic countries, and 9 WHEREAS, the celebration begins on September 15 to coincide with the national independence days of Guatemala, Honduras, El 10 11 Salvador, Nicaragua, and Costa Rica, and WHEREAS, the role of Afro-Latinos in Latin and Hispanic 12 13 heritage and cultures includes the first Black presidents in the 14 Americas, Vicente Guerrero, Mexico's president from April to December 1829, and Juan José Nieto Gil, who was appointed 15 16 President of Colombia from January 25 to July 18, 1861, and WHEREAS, there are many influential Latino and Hispanic 17 18 Americans, including civil rights activist and co-founder of the 19 National Farm Workers Association, Caesar Chavez; the first 20 Hispanic American woman to go to space and the first Hispanic 21 woman inducted into the U.S. Astronaut Hall of Fame, Ellen 22 Ochoa; and the first Hispanic American to serve as a member of 23 the U.S. Supreme Court, Justice Sonia Sotomayor, and
