WHEREAS, in 1972, Ron Richmond furthered his passion to serve others by becoming a representative in the Florida House of Representatives, where he first served House District 37 until 1982 and then, after reapportionment, House District 49 until 1984, and

WHEREAS, Representative Richmond was recognized by his Democratic counterparts, having been appointed to numerous chairmanships during his tenure, including chairman of the Alcoholic Beverages and Tobacco Subcommittee and chairman of the Consumer, Probate, and Family Law Subcommittee, and

WHEREAS, between 1982 and 1984, Representative Richmond served as the House Minority Leader for the Republican party in the Florida House of Representatives, and

WHEREAS, Leader Richmond was awarded several accolades during his legislative career, including the runner-up for the Most Effective in Committee in the House award in 1979, the runner-up for the Most Effective in Debate in the House award in 1981, and the runner-up for the Most Effective Member of the House award in 1982, and
