Paragraph (e) of subsection (4) of Article VIII of section 468.1335, Florida Statutes, as created by HB 877, 10 11 2023 Regular Session, is amended, and subsection (11) is added to Article III, paragraph (g) is added to subsection (1) of 12 13 Article IV, and paragraph (e) is added to subsection (5) of 14 Article VIII of that section, to read: 468.1335 Practice of Audiology and Speech-language 15 16 Pathology Interstate Compact. - The Practice of Audiology and Speech-language Pathology Interstate Compact is hereby enacted 17 18 into law and entered into by this state with all other states 19 legally joining therein in the form substantially as follows: 20 21 ARTICLE III 22 STATE PARTICIPATION 23 24 (11) Member states may charge a fee for granting compact 25 privilege.

10	(4) The executive committee shall have the power to act on
11	behalf of the commission according to the terms of the compact.
12	(e) The executive committee shall have the following
13	duties and responsibilities:
14	1. Recommend to the entire commission changes to the rules
15	or bylaws, changes to this compact legislation.
16	2. Ensure compact administration services are
17	appropriately provided, contractual or otherwise.
18	3. Prepare and recommend the budget.
19	4. Maintain financial records on behalf of the commission.
50	5. Monitor compact compliance of member states and provide

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compliance reports to the commission.

- 6. Establish additional committees as necessary.
- 7. Other duties as provided in rules or bylaws.
- 8. Recommend to the entire commission changes to fees paid by compact member states such as annual dues and any commission compact fee charged to licensees for compact privilege.
- (5) Relating to the financing of the commission, the commission:
- (e) May levy and collect an annual assessment from each member state or impose fees on other parties to cover the cost of the operations and activities of the commission and its staff, which must be in a total amount sufficient to cover its annual budget as approved each year for which revenue is not provided by other sources. The aggregate annual assessment amount shall be allocated based upon a formula to be determined by the commission, which shall adopt a rule binding upon all member states.
- Section 2. This act shall take effect on the same date that HB 877 or similar legislation takes effect, if such legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes a law.
