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12	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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14	Section 1. Section 381.00731, Florida Statutes, is created
15	to read:
16	381.00731 Toxic Mold Protection Advisory Council
17	(1) As used in this section, the term:
18	(a) "Affected" means affected by a condition caused by the
19	presence of mold in a dwelling unit, a building, an appurtenant
20	structure, a common wall, a heating system, or a ventilating or
21	air-conditioning system which affects the indoor air quality of
22	the dwelling unit or building.
23	(b) "Building code enforcement official" means a licensed
24	building code administrator, building code inspector, or plans
25	examiner.
26	(c) "Department" means the Department of Health.
27	(d) "Indoor environment" means the affected dwelling unit
28	or affected commercial and industrial building.
29	(e) "Industrial hygienist" has the same meaning as in s.

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30	501.937(3)(b).
31	(f) "Mold" means any form of multicellular fungi,
32	including, but not limited to, Cladosporium, Penicillium,
33	Alternaria, Aspergillus, Fusarium, Trichoderma, Memnoniella,
34	Mucor, and Stachybotrys chartarum, which lives on plant or
35	animal matter and in indoor environments and which is often
36	found in water-damaged building materials.
37	(g) "Public health officer" means a local health officer or
38	director of a county health department.
39	(2) The Toxic Mold Protection Advisory Council, an advisory
40	council as defined in s. 20.03(7), is created adjunct to the
41	department for the purpose of making recommendations and
42	advising and assisting the department in the development and
43	adoption of a public health education program and mold
44	identification, assessment, and remediation standards and
45	guidelines.
46	(3) The advisory council is composed of the following
47	members, appointed as follows:
48	(a) The following members appointed by the Secretary of
49	Business and Professional Regulation:
50	1. A person who is a building code enforcement official.
51	2. A person who is a mold assessment expert.
52	3. A person who is a mold abatement expert.
53	4. A person who is an industrial hygienist.
54	5. A person who represents an organization or association
55	that develops standards or certifications for the mold industry.
56	(b) The following members appointed by the State Surgeon
57	General:
58	1. A person who is a public health officer.

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59	2. A person who has medical expertise on the adverse health
60	effects from exposure to molds.
61	(c) A person who represents an organization or association
62	advocating for insurers, appointed by the Chief Financial
63	Officer.
64	(d) A person who represents a school district, appointed by
65	the Commissioner of Education.
66	(e) A person who is an environmental health professional,
67	appointed by the Secretary of Environmental Protection.
68	(f) The following members appointed by the President of the
69	Senate:
70	1. Two persons who represent organizations or associations
71	advocating for affected consumers, including one person who
72	represents commercial and industrial tenants and one person who
73	represents residential tenants and homeowners.
74	2. From recommendations provided by the chair of the
75	standing committee of the Senate with jurisdiction over health
76	policy, a person who represents an organization or association
77	with expertise on the adverse health effects from exposure to
78	molds.
79	(g) A person who represents an organization or association
80	advocating for affected industries, including, but not limited
81	to, commercial and industrial building proprietors, managers,
82	and landlords; residential building proprietors, managers, and
83	landlords; builders; realtors; suppliers of building materials;
84	and suppliers of furnishings, appointed by the Speaker of the
85	House of Representatives.
86	(4)(a) The initial members of the advisory council must be
87	appointed by September 1, 2023. Each member must be appointed to
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88	a 4-year term. However, in order to achieve staggered terms,
89	each of the initial members appointed pursuant to paragraphs
90	(3)(a), (b), and (c) must be appointed to a 2-year term and each
91	of the initial members appointed pursuant to paragraphs (3)(d),
92	(e), (f), and (g) must be appointed to a 4-year term.
93	(b) A vacancy on the advisory council must be filled in the
94	same manner as the original appointment.
95	(c) The advisory council shall elect a chair from among its
96	members.
97	(d) Members of the advisory council shall serve without
98	compensation and are not entitled to reimbursement for per diem
99	and travel expenses pursuant to s. 112.061.
100	(5)(a) The advisory council shall convene its first meeting
101	by October 1, 2023. Thereafter, the advisory council shall meet
102	upon the call of the chair or upon the request of a majority of
103	its members.
104	(b) Meetings may be conducted in person or by
105	teleconference or other electronic means.
106	(6) The advisory council shall make recommendations and
107	advise and assist the department regarding the development and
108	adoption of a public health education program for indoor
109	environments and of mold identification, assessment, and
110	remediation standards and guidelines.
111	(7) By February 1, 2024, and each February 1 thereafter,
112	the advisory council shall submit an annual report on its
113	progress in performing its duties under subsection (6) to the
114	Governor, the State Surgeon General, the President of the
115	Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
116	Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2023.
