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26	(1) Contingent upon legislative appropriation, the Growing
27	Teachers from Within Pilot Program is created within the
28	Department of Education. The purpose of the pilot program is to
29	assist school district employees who work in a public school but
30	are not employed as instructional personnel by removing barriers
31	to their obtaining a teaching certificate in order to help
32	alleviate the growing teacher shortage throughout this state.
33	(2) In order to participate in the pilot program, school
34	districts must submit an application to the department by
35	October 1, 2023. The Commissioner of Education shall select up
36	to three school districts for participation in the pilot
37	program. The commissioner shall select one school district of a
38	county with a population less than 100,000 as of the most recent
39	decennial census, one school district of a county with a
40	population between 100,000 and 500,000 as of the most recent
41	decennial census, and one school district of a county with a
42	population exceeding 500,000 as of the most recent decennial
43	census. The commissioner shall coordinate with state
44	universities in proximity of the selected school districts to
45	assist in the department's administration of the pilot program.
46	(3) To be eligible to participate in the pilot program, an
47	employee of a participating school district must:
48	(a) Be employed as an educational support employee or as
49	an education paraprofessional and have received an associate
50	degree or successfully completed 60 semester credit hours at a
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51 postsecondary institution. 52 (b) Commit to teach in the school district for a minimum 53 of 2 years or a pro rata number of years after obtaining a 54 teaching certificate. 55 (4) Funds appropriated for the pilot program must be used 56 for all of the following: 57 (a) Establishing a customized coursework schedule to allow for flexibility for participating school district employees to 58 59 complete credit hours toward earning a bachelor's degree while 60 maintaining employment with the school district and ultimately 61 attaining a teacher certification. (b) Financial support for tuition, credentials, 62 63 technology, and instructional materials for participating school 64 district employees. 65 (5) Participating school districts shall submit a report 66 to the Commissioner of Education by June 1 of each year for the 67 duration of the pilot program which includes, but is not limited 68 to, detailing findings regarding the pilot program's 69 implementation and whether it is meeting its intended goal of 70 serving as a recruitment tool and a strategy to retain school 71 district employees in order to alleviate the growing teacher 72 shortage in this state. 73 (6) The State Board of Education may adopt rules to 74 administer this section. 75 (7) This section expires June 30, 2026.
