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26 name and lot number, GPS coordinates, and any other descriptive 27 property information that may reveal the home address.

For written requests received on or before July 1, 2021, a county property appraiser or county tax 340 341 collector must comply with this sub-subparagraph by October 1, 342 2021. A county property appraiser or county tax collector may 343 not remove the street address, legal description, or other 344 information identifying real property within the agency's 345 records so long as a name or personal information otherwise 346 exempt from inspection and copying pursuant to this section is 347 not associated with the property or otherwise displayed in the 348 public records of the agency.

b. Any information restricted from public display,inspection, or copying under sub-subparagraph a. must be

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351 provided to the individual whose information was removed.

352 An officer, an employee, a justice, a judge, or other 5. 353 person specified in subparagraph 2. may submit a written request 354 for the release of his or her exempt information to the 355 custodial agency. The written request must be notarized and must 356 specify the information to be released and the party authorized 357 to receive the information. Upon receipt of the written request, 358 the custodial agency must release the specified information to 359 the party authorized to receive such information.

360 6. The exemptions in this paragraph apply to information
361 held by an agency before, on, or after the effective date of the
362 exemption.

363 7. Information made exempt under this paragraph may be 364 disclosed pursuant to s. 28.2221 to a title insurer authorized 365 pursuant to s. 624.401 and its affiliates as defined in s. 366 624.10; a title insurance agent or title insurance agency as 367 defined in s. 626.841(1) or (2), respectively; or an attorney 368 duly admitted to practice law in this state and in good standing 369 with The Florida Bar.

8. The exempt status of a home address contained in the Official Records is maintained only during the period when a protected party resides at the dwelling location. Upon conveyance of real property after October 1, 2021, and when such real property no longer constitutes a protected party's home address as defined in sub-subparagraph 1.a., the protected party

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376 must submit a written request to release the removed information 377 to the county recorder. The written request to release the 378 removed information must be notarized, must confirm that a 379 protected party's request for release is pursuant to a 380 conveyance of his or her dwelling location, and must specify the 381 Official Records book and page, instrument number, or clerk's 382 file number for each document containing the information to be 383 released.

384 9. Upon the death of a protected party as verified by a 385 certified copy of a death certificate or court order, any party 386 can request the county recorder to release a protected 387 decedent's removed information unless there is a related request 388 on file with the county recorder for continued removal of the 389 decedent's information or unless such removal is otherwise 390 prohibited by statute or by court order. The written request to 391 release the removed information upon the death of a protected 392 party must attach the certified copy of a death certificate or 393 court order and must be notarized, must confirm the request for 394 release is due to the death of a protected party, and must 395 specify the Official Records book and page number, instrument 396 number, or clerk's file number for each document containing the 397 information to be released. A fee may not be charged for the 398 release of any document pursuant to such request.

399 10. Except as otherwise expressly provided in this400 paragraph, this paragraph is subject to the Open Government

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401 Sunset Review Act in accordance with s. 119.15 and shall stand 402 repealed on October 2, 2024, unless reviewed and saved from 403 repeal through reenactment by the Legislature. 404 Section 2. The Legislature finds that it is a public 405 necessity that the home addresses, telephone numbers, dates of 406 birth, and photographs of current or former medical examiners; 407 the names, home addresses, telephone numbers, dates of birth, and places of employment of the spouses and children of such 408 409 current or former medical examiners; and the names and locations 410 of schools and day care facilities attended by the children of 411 such current or former medical examiners be made exempt from s. 412 119.07(1), Florida Statutes, and s. 24(a), Article I of the 413 State Constitution. The Legislature finds that the release of 414 such personal identifying and location information poses 415 potential security risks for and allows unwarranted intrusion 416 into the private lives of such current or former medical 417 examiners and their family members. Public availability of such 418 personal identifying and location information may compromise the 419 ability of such current or former medical examiners to carry out 420 their public duties and disrupt the operation of the district medical examiner's office. The exemption of such personal 421 422 identifying and location information from public records 423 requirements is necessary to protect the personal privacy and 424 safety of these public servants and their families. The 425 Legislature finds that the harm that may result from the release

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426	of such personal identifying and location information outweighs
427	any public benefit that may be derived from the disclosure of
428	the information.
429	Section 3. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.

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
