The Committee on Rules (Collins) recommended the following:

Senate Amendment

Delete lines 22 - 51

and insert:

a. Fifty hours of training in business or public administration, business or public management, or emergency management or preparedness. A bachelor's degree may be substituted for this requirement.

b. Four years of verifiable experience in comprehensive emergency management services, which includes improving preparedness for emergency and disaster protection, prevention,

12 mitigation, response, and recovery, with direct supervisory
13 responsibility for responding to at least one emergency or
14 disaster.

15 (I) A master's degree in emergency preparedness or
16 management, business or public administration, communications,
17 finance, homeland security, public health, criminal justice,
18 meteorology, or environmental science may be substituted for 2
19 years of experience required under this sub-subparagraph but not
20 for the required supervisory experience.

21 (II) A valid accreditation as a Certified Master Exercise
22 Practitioner through the Federal Emergency Management Agency, as
23 a Certified Emergency Manager through the International
24 Association of Emergency Managers, or as a Florida Professional
25 Emergency Manager through the Florida Professional Emergency
26 Preparedness Association may be substituted for the requirements
27 of this sub-subparagraph. A certification used as substitution
28 for the requirements of this sub-subparagraph must be currently
29 maintained in good standing at all times until the actual time
30 and experience requirements satisfying this sub-subparagraph are
31 met by the appointee.

32 c. One hundred fifty hours in comprehensive emergency
33 management training provided through or approved by the Federal
34 Emergency Management Agency or its successor, including
35 completion of the following National Incident Management System
36 courses, or equivalent courses established by the Federal
37 Emergency Management Agency through the Emergency Management
38 Institute:

39 (I) ICS-100: Introduction to the Incident Command System;
