A bill to be entitled

An act relating to educational services in Department of Juvenile Justice programs; amending s. 1003.52, F.S.; requiring school districts to annually provide certain students in a juvenile justice program with at least one opportunity to take the high school equivalency examination at no cost to the student; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Paragraph (c) of subsection (3) of section 1003.52, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

1003.52 Educational services in Department of Juvenile Justice programs.—

- (3) The district school board of the county in which the juvenile justice education prevention, day treatment, residential, or detention program is located shall provide or contract for appropriate educational assessments and an appropriate program of instruction and special education services.
- (c) The district school board shall make provisions for each student to participate in basic, CAPE, and exceptional student programs as appropriate. Students served in Department of Juvenile Justice education programs shall have access to the appropriate courses and instruction to prepare them for the high school equivalency examination. Students participating in high school equivalency examination preparation programs shall be funded at the basic program cost factor for Department of

Juvenile Justice programs in the Florida Education Finance Program. Each program shall be conducted according to applicable law providing for the operation of public schools and rules of the State Board of Education. School districts shall provide the high school equivalency examination exit option for all juvenile justice education programs and provide each student who is 16 years of age or older with the opportunity to take the high school equivalency examination at least once a year at no cost to the student.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2024.
