The final order must be entered according to the

- (b) If the secretary makes a finding that the requirements of a basis license in another jurisdiction are substantially equivalent to or otherwise sufficient for a license in this state, the board, or the department if there is no board, must make the same finding for similar applicants from the same jurisdiction, unless the requirements of the basis license are changed.
- (c) As used in this subsection, the term "basis license" means the license or the licensure requirements of another jurisdiction which are used to meet the requirements for a license in this state.
 - Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2024.
