- (1) As used in this section, the term:
- (a) "Broadcast" means electronically transmitting a visual image or visual recording with the intent that it be viewed by another person.
- (b) "Family or household member" has the same meaning as in s. 741.28.
- (c) (b) "Imaging device" means any mechanical, digital, or electronic viewing device; still camera; camcorder; motion picture camera; or any other instrument, equipment, or format capable of recording, storing, or transmitting visual images of another person.
- (d) "Position of authority or trust" means a position occupied by a person 18 years of age or older who is a relative, caregiver, coach, employer, or other person who, by reason of his or her relationship with the victim, is able to exercise undue influence over him or her or exploit his or her trust.

- (f)(e) "Place and time when a person has a Reasonable expectation of privacy" means circumstances under which a place and time when a reasonable person would believe that he or she could fully disrobe in privacy, without being concerned that the person's undressing was being viewed, recorded, or broadcasted by another, including, but not limited to, the interior of a residential dwelling, bathroom, changing room, fitting room,

- (2)  $\underline{\text{(a)}}$  A person commits the offense of  $\underline{\text{digital}}$  voyeurism if that person:
- 1. (a) For his or her own amusement, entertainment, sexual arousal, gratification, or profit, or for the purpose of degrading, exploiting, or abusing another person, intentionally uses or installs an imaging device to secretly view, broadcast, or record a person, without that person's knowledge and consent, who is dressing, undressing, or privately exposing the body, at a place and time when that person has a reasonable expectation of privacy;
- 2.(b) For the amusement, entertainment, sexual arousal, gratification, or profit of another, or on behalf of another, intentionally permits the use or installation of an imaging device to secretly view, broadcast, or record a person, without that person's knowledge and consent, who is dressing, undressing, or privately exposing the body, at a place and time when that person has a reasonable expectation of privacy; or
- 3.(c) For the amusement, entertainment, sexual arousal, gratification, or profit of oneself or another, or on behalf of oneself or another, intentionally uses an imaging device to secretly view, broadcast, or record under or through the clothing being worn by another person, without that person's knowledge and consent, for the purpose of viewing the body of, or the undergarments worn by, that person.

- (b) A person who violates this subsection commits a felony of the third degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.
- (4) A person commits the offense of commercial <u>digital</u> video voyeurism dissemination if that person:
- (a) Knowing or having reason to believe that an image <u>or recording</u> was created in a manner described in <u>subsection (2)</u> this section, sells the image <u>or recording</u> for consideration to another person; or
  - (b) Having created the image or recording in a manner

- (c) A person who violates this subsection commits a felony of the third degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.
  - (5) This section does not apply to any:
- (a) Law enforcement agency conducting surveillance for a law enforcement purpose;
- (b) Security system when a written notice is conspicuously posted on the premises stating that a video surveillance system has been installed for the purpose of security for the premises;
- (c) Video surveillance device that is installed in such a manner that the presence of the device is clearly and immediately obvious; or
- (d) Dissemination, distribution, or transfer of images or recordings subject to this section by a provider of an electronic communication service as defined in 18 U.S.C. s. 2510(15), or a provider of a remote computing service as defined in 18 U.S.C. s. 2711(2). For purposes of this section, the exceptions to the definition of "electronic communication" set forth in 18 U.S.C. s. 2510(12)(a), (b), (c), and (d) do not apply, but are included within the definition of the term.
- (6) <u>Each instance of secretly viewing a person in</u> violation of subsection (2) or broadcasting, recording,
