5 Remove lines 78-111 and insert:

6 million. Beginning July 1, 2025, and each July 1 thereafter, the  
7 Department of Management Services shall adjust the maximum  
8 amount allowed on the preceding June 30 for each individual  
9 project in a continuing contract by using the change in the  
10 June-to-June Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers issued

12 Department of Labor. The Department of Management Services shall  
13 publish the adjusted amount on its website. For purposes of this  
14 subsection, the term "continuing contract" means a contract with  
15 a construction management or program management entity for work  
16 during a defined period on construction projects described by

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17 type which may or may not be identified at the time of entering  
18 into the contract.

19 Section 2. Paragraph (g) of subsection (2) of section  
20 287.055, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

21 287.055 Acquisition of professional architectural,  
22 engineering, landscape architectural, or surveying and mapping  
23 services; definitions; procedures; contingent fees prohibited;  
24 penalties.—

25 (2) DEFINITIONS.—For purposes of this section:

26 (g)1. A "continuing contract" is a contract for any of the  
27 following:

28 a. Professional services entered into in accordance with  
29 all the procedures of this act between an agency and a firm  
30 whereby the firm provides professional services to the agency  
31 for projects in which the estimated construction cost of each  
32 individual project under the contract does not exceed \$7.5 \$4  
33 million. Beginning July 1, 2025, and each July 1 thereafter, the  
34 department shall adjust the maximum amount allowed on the  
35 preceding June 30 for each individual project in a continuing  
36 contract by using the change in the June-to-June Consumer Price  
37 Index for All Urban Consumers issued by the Bureau of Labor  
38 Statistics of the United States Department of Labor. The  
39 department shall publish the adjusted amount on its website;
