| 14 | Section 1. Section 1004.444, Florida Statutes, is amended |

| 16 | 1004.444 Florida Center for Cybersecurity |
| 17 | (1) The Florida Center for Cybersecurity, which may also |
| 18 | be referred to as "Cyber Florida," is established within the |
| 19 | University of South Florida, under the direction of the |
| 20 | president of the university or the president's designee. |
| 21 | (2) The mission and goals of the center are to: |
| 22 | (a) Position Florida as the national leader in |
| 23 | cybersecurity and its related workforce primarily through |
| 24 | advancing and funding education $\underline{	ext{and}}_{	au}$ research $\underline{	ext{and}}$ development |
| 25 | initiatives in cybersecurity and related fields, with a |
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| 26 | secondary emphasis on , and community engagement and |
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| 27 | cybersecurity awareness. |
| 28 | (b) Assist in the creation of jobs in the state's |
| 29 | cybersecurity industry and enhance the existing cybersecurity |
| 30 | workforce through education, research, applied science, and |
| 31 | engagements and partnerships with the private and military |
| 32 | sectors. |
| 33 | (c) Act as a cooperative facilitator for state business |
| 34 | and higher education communities to share cybersecurity |
| 35 | knowledge, resources, and training. |
| 36 | (d) Seek out research and development agreements and other |
| 37 | partnerships with major military installations and affiliated |
| 38 | contractors to assist, when possible, in homeland cybersecurity |
| 39 | defense initiatives. |
| 40 | (e) Attract cybersecurity companies <u>and jobs</u> to <u>this</u> the |
| 41 | state <u>,</u> with an emphasis on <u>the</u> defense, finance, health care, |
| 42 | transportation, and utility sectors. |
| 43 | (f) Conduct, fund, and facilitate research and applied |
| 44 | science that leads to the creation of new technologies and |
| 45 | software packages that have military and civilian applications |
| 46 | and that can be transferred for military and homeland defense |
| 47 | purposes or for sale or use in the private sector. |
| 48 | (3) Upon receiving a request for assistance from the |
| 49 | Department of Management Services, the Florida Digital Service, |
| 50 | or another state agency, the center is authorized, but may not |
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| 51 | be compelled by the agency, to conduct, consult on, or otherwise |
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| 52 | assist any state-funded initiatives related to: |
| 53 | (a) Cybersecurity training, professional development, and |
| 54 | education for state and local government employees, including |
| 55 | school districts and the judicial branch; and |
| 56 | (b) Increasing the cybersecurity effectiveness of the |
