Medicare-granted extensions for filing cost 29 reports, if applicable, shall also apply to Medicaid cost 30 reports. Payment for Medicaid compensable services made on behalf of Medicaid-eligible persons is subject to the 31 32 availability of moneys and any limitations or directions provided for in the General Appropriations Act or chapter 216. 33 34 Further, nothing in this section shall be construed to prevent 35 or limit the agency from adjusting fees, reimbursement rates, lengths of stay, number of visits, or number of services, or 36 making any other adjustments necessary to comply with the 37 availability of moneys and any limitations or directions 38 39 provided for in the General Appropriations Act, provided the 40 adjustment is consistent with legislative intent. 41 (27) The services provided by an advanced practice 42 registered nurse or a physician assistant acting within his or 43 her scope of practice who is providing behavioral health 44 services under the general supervision of a physician may be 45 billed under the supervising physician's Medicaid provider when 46 the supervising physician is not in the building, but is 47 available to render assistance to the advanced practice 48 registered nurse or physician assistant. 49 Section 2.
