9 Section 6. Subsection (4) is added to section 627.657,  
 10 Florida Statutes, to read:

11 627.657 Provisions of group health insurance policies.—

12 (4) (a) A group health insurance policy that is delivered  
 13 or issued to any group in the state may offer, for an  
 14 appropriate additional premium, coverage for sex-reassignment  
 15 prescriptions or procedures, as defined in s. 456.001, only if  
 16 the same group health insurance policy also provides coverage

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17 for treatment to detransition from the sex-reassignment  
18 prescriptions or procedures.

19 (b) A group health insurer that delivers or issues a group  
20 health insurance policy that provides coverage described under  
21 paragraph (a) must also offer a group health insurance policy  
22 that does not provide such coverage.

23 (c) This subsection applies to group health insurance  
24 policies delivered, issued, or renewed on or after January 1,  
25 2025.

29 (5) AVAILABILITY OF COVERAGE.—

30 (h)1. A health benefit plan that is delivered or issued to  
31 an individual or a group in the state may offer, for an  
32 appropriate additional premium, coverage for sex-reassignment  
33 prescriptions or procedures, as defined in s. 456.001, only if  
34 the same health benefit plan also provides coverage for  
35 treatment to detransition from the sex-reassignment  
36 prescriptions or procedures.

37 2. A carrier that delivers or issues a health benefit plan  
38 that provides coverage described under subparagraph 1. must also  
39 offer a health benefit plan that does not provide such coverage.

40 3. This paragraph applies to health benefit plans  
41 delivered, issued, or renewed on or after January 1, 2025.

47 appropriate additional premium, coverage for sex-reassignment  
48 prescriptions or procedures, as defined in s. 456.001, only if  
49 the same health maintenance contract also provides coverage for  
50 treatment to detransition from the sex-reassignment  
51 prescriptions or procedures.

52 (b) A health maintenance organization that delivers or  
53 issues a health maintenance contract that provides coverage  
54 described under paragraph (a) must also offer a health  
55 maintenance contract that does not provide such coverage.
