The Legislature finds that the release of such personal identifying information could subject the persons applying for compensation through the Dozier School for Boys and Okeechobee School Victim Compensation Program to the possibility of harassment and to further trauma should their status as a victim of the Dozier School for Boys or the Okeechobee School, or the nature of the abuse each victim suffered there, be made public.
