- (c) A secure continuous remote alcohol monitor may not be required for a first misdemeanor offense unless it is shown by clear and convincing evidence that such a monitor is required to protect the public safety.
- (4) Notwithstanding any other law, a defendant may not be required to surrender a license to carry a concealed weapon or concealed firearm in conjunction with a first misdemeanor offense unless it appears that the defendant would present a danger to the public if he or she were to possess the concealed weapon or concealed firearm.
 - Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2024.
