33	Section 1. This act may be cited as the "HeartCharged

39	(1)(a) In addition to the requirements of s. 1006.165,
40	each public school must have at least one operational automated
41	external defibrillator on school grounds. Each defibrillator
42	must be stored in a location that is easily accessible to anyone
43	at any time during the school day and any other time students
44	are on school grounds, including outside of the school year.
45	Such defibrillator may not be placed in the school's athletic
46	facilities. Each defibrillator must have appropriate
47	accompanying signage, including, but not limited to, signage at
48	the defibrillator's exact location directing responders to the
49	building or room where the defibrillator is routinely kept. Each
50	defibrillator and all of its components must be maintained
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51	according to the manufacturer's instructions and kept in proper			
52	working order. Each school is encouraged to have or work towards			
53	acquiring and placing a sufficient number of defibrillators on			
54	school grounds, as determined by the Department of Education, to			
55	allow a person to retrieve a defibrillator within 3 minutes
