

26 local law enforcement agencies in the processing of DNA samples
27 as provided for in subsection (4).

28 (3) The department shall annually award to law enforcement
29 agencies and medical examiner's offices any funds specially
30 appropriated for the grant program to cover expenses related to
31 using forensic genetic genealogy methods to generate
32 investigative leads for criminal investigations or unidentified
33 human remains.

34 (4) Grants may be used for the following:

35 (a) Carrying out DNA analyses of samples collected under
36 applicable legal authority using forensic genetic genealogy
37 methods for violent crimes.

38 (b) Carrying out DNA analyses of unidentified human
39 remains.

40 (5) Each recipient shall provide to the executive director
41 a report no later than 1 year after receipt of funding. This
42 report shall include:

43 (a) The amount of annual funding received.

44 (b) The number of cases tested using forensic genetic
45 genealogical DNA analysis.

46 (c) The type of forensic genetic genealogical DNA testing
47 used, including the name of the laboratory to which such testing
48 is outsourced, if any, and the type of equipment used for the
49 testing.

50 (d) The result of the testing, such as victim

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51 identification, perpetrator identification, or no
52 identification.

53 (e) The average amount of time it took to make each such
54 identification.

55 Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2024.
