- (b) The Medicaid buy-in program must provide full Medicaid benefits to eligible individuals and must limit any premiums or cost sharing to a certain percentage of an individual's income, as determined by the agency.
- (2) By October 1, 2024, the agency shall seek federal waiver approval or submit any state plan amendments necessary to implement the Medicaid buy-in program under this section. The agency shall implement the program upon receiving federal approval.
  - Section 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
