12 opioid antagonists as an effective way to rapidly 13 reverse the effects of opioid overdose; providing an 14 effective date. 15 WHEREAS, the opioid epidemic continues to ravage American 16 17 families across the United States, and 18 WHEREAS, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention 19 reported more than 100,000 overdose deaths in the United States 20 during the 12-month period that ended in February 2023, and 21 WHEREAS, most of these deaths were caused by illicit 22 synthetic drugs like clandestinely manufactured fentanyl, often 23 in combination with other drugs, and 24 WHEREAS, in 2021, nearly 71,000 drug overdose deaths 25 involving synthetic opioids occurred in the United States, which 26 was more deaths that year than from any other type of opioid, 27 and 28 WHEREAS, synthetic-opioid-involved death rates increased by 29 more than 22 percent from 2020 to 2021 and synthetic opioids 30 accounted for nearly 88 percent of all opioid-involved deaths in 31 2021, and 32 WHEREAS, by comparison, from 1999 to 2021, nearly 280,000 33 people died in the United States from overdoses involving prescription opioids, and 34 WHEREAS, the number of drug overdose deaths involving 35 36 prescription opioids in 2021 was nearly five times the number in 37 1999, and WHEREAS, in 2021, an average of 45 people died each day 38 39 from a prescription opioid overdose, for a total of nearly 40 17,000 deaths, and

41 WHEREAS, in 2021, nearly 21 percent of all opioid overdose 42 deaths involved prescription opioids, and WHEREAS, 60 percent of all opioid overdose deaths occur in 43 44 the home, and WHEREAS, in 67 percent of opioid overdose deaths, another 45 46 person was present at the time and witnessed the death, and 47 WHEREAS, opioid antagonists are a safe, powerful medication that can reverse opioid-related overdoses and prevent overdose 48 49 deaths, and 50 WHEREAS, in 2023, in a historic action, the United States 51 Food and Drug Administration approved naloxone nasal spray as 52 the first over-the-counter opioid antagonist, and 53 WHEREAS, most Americans remain unaware of the safety, 54 availability, and efficacy of opioid antagonists as a life-55 saving treatment for opioid overdose, and 56 WHEREAS, the national advocacy efforts of David Siegel and 57 Jackie Siegel are recognized as they advocate for widespread 58 availability of opioid antagonists through the Victoria's Voice
