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3 **Amendment to Amendment (545678) (with title amendment)**

4 Remove lines 116-271 of the amendment and insert:

5 Section 6. Section 509.098, Florida Statutes, is amended
6 to read:

7 509.098 Prohibition on offering or renting an
8 accommodation on an hourly basis or other specified time period
9 of hourly rates.-

10 (1) An operator of a public lodging establishment may not
11 offer or rent an hourly rate for an accommodation on an hourly
12 basis or for a period of less than 12 consecutive hours.

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13 (2) This section does not prohibit a public lodging
14 establishment from charging ~~apply to an hourly rate charged by~~
15 ~~an operator of a public lodging establishment as a late checkout~~
16 fee, however a public lodging establishment may not offer a
17 discount or rebate for early checkout of an accommodation that
18 is occupied for less than 12 consecutive hours.

19 (3) The division must impose a \$2,500 administrative fine
20 on a public lodging establishment for each violation of this
21 section and must remit any collected fines to the direct-support
22 organization established under s. 16.618.

23 Section 7. Subsection (13) is added to section 787.06,
24 Florida Statutes, to read:

25 787.06 Human trafficking.—

26 (13) When a contract is executed, renewed, or extended
27 between a nongovernmental entity and a governmental entity, the
28 nongovernmental entity must provide the governmental entity with
29 an affidavit signed by an officer or a representative of the
30 nongovernmental entity under penalty of perjury attesting that
31 the nongovernmental entity does not use coercion for labor or
32 services as defined in this section. For purposes of this
33 subsection, the term "governmental entity" has the same meaning
34 as in s. 287.138(1).

35 Section 8. Subsection (4) of section 787.29, Florida
36 Statutes, is amended to read:

37 787.29 Human trafficking public awareness signs.—

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38 (4) The required public awareness sign must be at least
39 8.5 inches by 11 inches in size, must be printed in at least a
40 16-point type, and must state substantially the following in
41 English and Spanish:

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43 "If you or someone you know is being forced to engage
44 in an activity and cannot leave—whether it is
45 prostitution, housework, farm work, factory work,
46 retail work, restaurant work, or any other activity—
47 call the Florida Human Trafficking Hotline, 1-855-FLA-
48 SAFE, the National Human Trafficking Resource Center
49 at 1-888-373-7888 or text INFO or HELP to 233-733 to
50 access help and services. Victims of slavery and human
51 trafficking are protected under United States and
52 Florida law."
