A bill to be entitled

An act relating to candidate qualifying; creating s. 99.013, F.S.; providing eligibility requirements for persons seeking to qualify for nomination as a candidate of a political party or as a candidate with no party affiliation; providing that certain entities may bring an action for declaratory and injunctive relief based on a certain claim; prohibiting a person from qualifying as a candidate for election and from having his or her name appear on the ballot under certain circumstances; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 99.013, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

99.013 Eligibility to qualify for nomination as a candidate of a political party or candidate with no party affiliation.—

(1) (a) A person seeking to qualify for nomination as a candidate of a political party must have been a registered member of the political party for which the person is seeking nomination as a candidate for at least 365 days before the beginning of qualifying preceding the general election for which the person seeks to qualify.

(b) A person seeking to qualify for nomination as a candidate with no party affiliation must be registered without any party affiliation and may not have been a registered member of any political party for at least 365 days before the beginning of qualifying preceding the general election for which

the person seeks to qualify.

- (2) A political party, in addition to any other person or entity with standing, may bring an action for declaratory and injunctive relief based on a claim that a person seeking to qualify for nomination as a candidate of such political party or as a candidate with no party affiliation did not comply with this section.
- (3) If a final judgment of a circuit court determines that a person did not comply with this section, the person may not be qualified as a candidate for election and his or her name may not appear on the ballot.
  - Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2024.
