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5	WHEREAS, childhood and adolescent cancer is the leading
6	cause of death by disease among children and adolescents in the
7	United States, and
8	WHEREAS, in 2023, approximately 15,000 children and
9	adolescents in the United States were diagnosed with cancer, and
10	an estimated 1,500 died of the disease, and
11	WHEREAS, as of January 1, 2020, there were approximately
12	495,739 survivors of childhood and adolescent cancer in the
13	United States, and
14	WHEREAS, each year, hundreds of children and adolescents in
15	the state battle against cancer, many of whom will experience
16	late-term effects from treatment, including secondary cancers,
17	which also impacts their parents, grandparents, friends,
18	neighbors, and communities, and
19	WHEREAS, many childhood and adolescent cancer patients
20	experience late-term effects from chemotherapy or radiation
21	treatment, which may persist or develop for years after the
22	cancer diagnosis, and
23	WHEREAS, there are many healthcare professionals,
24	researchers, and advocates in the state who work tirelessly to

25 improve existing treatments and find cures for childhood and 26 adolescent cancer, and

27 WHEREAS, the state is home to several nationally acclaimed 28 treatment centers and research institutions dedicated to 29 pediatric cancer, all of which have contributed significantly to 30 clinical trials and therapies, and

31 WHEREAS, as a result of improved treatment options, the 32 relative survival rate of at least 5 years after diagnosis is 33 greater than 80 percent, with survival rates varying based on 34 the type of cancer and the age of the patient, and

35 WHEREAS, every child deserves to grow and thrive in a 36 healthy and nurturing environment, and

37 WHEREAS, raising awareness of childhood and adolescent 38 cancer can inspire compassion, support, and action to improve 39 the lives of children and adolescents in the state, and

WHEREAS, raising awareness of childhood and adolescent cancer can educate individuals about the unique challenges faced by children and adolescents diagnosed with cancer and their families, including the side effects of treatment, the financial burden, and the psychological trauma, and

WHEREAS, the federal government recognizes September as National Childhood Cancer Awareness Month which underscores the importance of this issue and the collective national effort required to address and combat the impacts of childhood and adolescent cancer, and, NOW, THEREFORE,
