24	(3)(a) A firefighter or a law enforcement officer,
25	correctional officer, or correctional probation officer as
26	defined in s. 943.10(1), (2), or (3), respectively, requiring
27	medical treatment for a compensable presumptive condition listed
28	in subsection (1) may be treated by a medical specialist. Except
29	in emergency situations, a firefighter, law enforcement officer,

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30	correctional officer, or correctional probation officer entitled
31	to receive treatment by a medical specialist under this
32	subsection must provide notice of his or her selection of a
33	medical specialist to his or her workers' compensation carrier,
34	self-insured employer, or third-party administrator, as
35	applicable, before he or she begins treatment, and the workers'
36	compensation carrier, self-insured employer, or third-party
37	administrator must authorize and schedule the appointment and
38	treatment with the medical specialist. The treatment by a
39	medical specialist must be reasonable, necessary, and related to
40	tuberculosis, heart disease, or hypertension and reimbursed at
41	no more than 200 percent of the Medicare rate.
42	(b) For purposes of this subsection, the term "medical
43	specialist" means a physician licensed under chapter 458 or
44	chapter 459 who has board certification in a medical specialty
45	inclusive of care and treatment of tuberculosis, heart disease,
46	or hypertension.
