An act relating to offenses involving gift cards;

creating ss. 812.0152, 817.5696, and 831.095, F.S.;

providing definitions; prohibiting gift card theft,

gift card fraud, and gift card forgery, respectively;

providing criminal penalties; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 812.0152, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

812.0152 Gift card theft.-

- (1) As used in this section, the term:
- (a) "Card issuer" means the issuer of a gift card or an agent of such issuer with respect to such card.
- (b) "Cardholder" means a person to whom a physical or virtual gift card is issued or a person who has agreed with the card issuer to pay obligations arising from the issuance of a gift card to another person.
- (c) "Closed-loop gift card" means a card, code, or device that is issued to a consumer on a prepaid basis primarily for personal, family, or household purposes in a specified amount, regardless of whether that amount may be increased or reloaded in exchange for payment, and that is redeemable upon

presentation by a consumer at a single merchant or group of
affiliated merchants.

- (d) "Gift card" means a physical or digital closed-loop gift card or open-loop gift card that is either activated or inactivated.
- (e) "Gift card redemption information" means information unique to each gift card which allows the cardholder to access, transfer, or spend the funds on such gift card.
- (f) "Gift card seller" means a merchant engaged in the business of selling open-loop gift cards or closed-loop gift cards to consumers.
- (g) "Open-loop gift card" means a card, code, or device that is issued to a consumer on a prepaid basis primarily for personal, family, or household purposes in a specified amount, regardless of whether that amount may be increased or reloaded in exchange for payment, and that is redeemable upon presentation by a consumer at multiple unaffiliated merchants for goods or services within the card network.
- (h) "Value" means the full monetary face value of a gift card or, for a variable-load gift card, the potential value of the variable-load gift card.
- (2) A person who, with intent to defraud, acquires or retains possession of a gift card or gift card redemption information without the consent of the cardholder, card issuer, or gift card seller commits gift card theft, punishable as

(3) A person who, with intent to defraud, uses, for the purpose of obtaining money, goods, services, or anything else of value, a gift card or gift card redemption information that has been obtained in violation of subsection (2) or s. 831.095 commits gift card theft, punishable as provided in s. 812.014.

Section 2. Section 817.5696, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

817.5696 Gift card fraud.-

- (1) As used in this section, the terms "gift card," "gift card redemption information," "cardholder," "card issuer," and "gift card seller" have the same meanings as in s. 812.0152(1).
- (2) A person who, with intent to defraud, knowingly devises a scheme to obtain a gift card or gift card redemption information from a cardholder, card issuer, or gift card seller by means of false or fraudulent pretenses, representations, or promises commits gift card fraud, a felony of the third degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.

Section 3. Section 831.095, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

- 831.095 Gift card forgery.—
- (1) As used in this section, the term "gift card" has the same meaning as in s. 812.0152(1).
- (2) A person who, with intent to injure or defraud, alters or tampers with a gift card commits gift card forgery, a felony
