49 (2) Each member of the council shall be appointed to a 4-50 year term; however, for the purpose of providing staggered 51 terms, of the initial appointments, 9 members shall be appointed 52 to 2-year terms and 10 members shall be appointed to 4-year 53 terms. A member of the council may be removed at any time by the 54 member's appointing authority who shall fill the vacancy on the 55 council.

56 (3)(a) At the first meeting of the council each year, the57 members shall elect a chair and a vice chair.

58 (b) A vacancy in the office of chair or vice chair <u>must</u>
59 shall be filled by vote of the remaining members.

(4) (a) The council shall make a systematic study of the
conditions affecting black men and boys, including, but not
limited to, homicide rates, arrest and incarceration rates,
poverty, violence, drug abuse, death rates, disparate annual
income levels, school performance in all grade levels including
postsecondary levels, and health issues.

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(b) The council shall propose measures to alleviate and
correct the underlying causes of the conditions described in
paragraph (a). These measures may consist of changes to the law
or systematic changes that can be implemented without
legislative action.

(c) The council may study other topics suggested by theLegislature or as directed by the chair of the council.

(d) The council shall receive suggestions or comments pertinent to the applicable issues from members of the Legislature, governmental agencies, public and private organizations, and private citizens.

(e) The council shall develop a strategic program and
funding initiative to establish local Councils on the Social
Status of Black Men and Boys.

(5) The council may:

81 (a) Access data held by any state departments or agencies,82 which data is otherwise a public record.

(b) Make requests directly to the Joint Legislative
Auditing Committee for assistance with research and monitoring
of outcomes by the Office of Program Policy Analysis and
Government Accountability.

87 (c) Request, through council members who are also
88 legislators, research assistance from the Office of Economic and
89 Demographic Research within the Florida Legislature.

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90 (d) Request information and assistance from the state or
91 any political subdivision, municipal corporation, public
92 officer, or governmental department thereof.

93 (e) Apply for and accept funds, grants, gifts, and 94 services from the state, the Federal Government or any of its 95 agencies, or any other public or private source for the purpose 96 of defraying clerical and administrative costs as may be 97 necessary for carrying out its duties under this section.

98 (f) Work directly with, or request information and 99 assistance on issues pertaining to education from, Florida's 100 historically black colleges and universities.

(6) <u>Florida Memorial University</u> The Office of the Attorney
 General shall provide staff and administrative support to the
 council.

(7) The council shall meet quarterly and at other times at the call of the chair or as determined by a majority of council members and approved by the <u>president of Florida Memorial</u> University Attorney Ceneral.

108 (8) Eleven of the members of the council constitute a
109 quorum, and an affirmative vote of a majority of the members
110 present is required for final action.
