13	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
14	
15	Section 1. Section 430.505, Florida Statutes, is created
16	to read:
17	430.505 Alzheimer's Disease Awareness Initiative
18	(1) The Department of Elder Affairs shall contract for the
19	development and implementation of the Alzheimer's Disease
20	Awareness Initiative. The initiative must provide an opportunity
21	for those affected by Alzheimer's disease and related forms of
22	dementia in this state to benefit from greater support and
23	obtain information that is validated in national research.
24	(2) The initiative must, at a minimum:
25	(a) Include a website and other related electronic
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26	resources that will address all of the following:
27	1. The advantages of early detection and diagnosis.
28	2. How to reduce risk factors.
29	3. The importance of brain health.
30	4. The importance of talking to a professional about being
31	screened and assessed for Alzheimer's Disease and related forms
32	of dementia.
33	5. How to promote healthy aging.
34	6. Recent progress in Alzheimer's research and the
35	availability of clinical trials.
36	7. Community resources available for those affected by the
37	disease and related forms of dementia.
38	8. Any related topics as deemed appropriate by the
39	Department of Elder Affairs.
40	(b) Use the Department of Health's Alzheimer's Disease and
41	Related Dementias Resource Guide as a part of the initiative
42	materials.
43	(c) Promote health care provider education in partnership
44	with the Department of Elder Affairs to help improve care and
45	services for patients with Alzheimer's disease and related forms
46	of dementia in accordance with s. 381.825.
47	(d) Use print, outdoor, and digital advertising, social
48	media platforms, and public events.
49	(e) Include a statewide mobile in-person outreach program
50	that prioritizes those in underserved communities and provide

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51	information on issues relating to Alzheimer's disease and
52	related forms of dementia, including, but not limited to, brain
53	health, risk education, and early detection and diagnosis. The
54	program may also provide referrals to the Department of Elder
55	Affairs and provide information regarding any available
56	community resources relating to Alzheimer's disease and related
57	forms of dementia.
58	(3)(a) The entity with which the Department of Elder
59	Affairs contracts for the Alzheimer's Disease Awareness
60	Initiative must be a statewide nonprofit organization that:
61	1. Has a history of focusing on those affected by
62	Alzheimer's disease and related forms of dementia, care,
63	support, and research including providing online resources to
64	caregivers and people living with the disease and through
65	community-based events.
66	2. Has the organizational capacity to manage a statewide
67	initiative and successfully carry out the requirements of this
68	section.
69	(b) The entity must collaborate with other relevant
70	agencies of state government and private organizations to
71	develop and implement the initiative. Such agencies of state
72	government must collaborate with the entity with which the
73	department contracts to carry out the initiative.
74	(4) The Alzheimer's Disease Advisory Committee shall make
75	recommendations to the Department of Elder Affairs and the

- 79 Section 2. This act shall take effect on July 1, 2025.

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
