Representative Oliver offered the following:

Amendment (with title amendment)

Remove lines 132-145

Between lines 692 and 693, insert:

Section 35. The Agency for Health Care Administration shall
develop a comprehensive plan to redesign the Florida Medicaid
Model Waiver for home and community-based services to include
children who receive private duty nursing services. The plan
must propose an array of tiered services with the goal of
ensuring that institutional care is avoided so children can
remain in the home or other community setting. The agency must
work with stakeholders in developing the plan, including, but

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17 not limited to, families of children in the Model Waiver or
18 receiving private duty nursing, advocates for children,
19 providers of services to children receiving private duty
20 nursing, and Statewide Medicaid Managed Care plans. The Agency
21 for Health Care Administration is authorized to contract with
22 necessary experts to assist in developing the plan. The Agency
23 for Health Care Administration must submit a report to the
24 Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the
25 House of Representatives by September 30, 2025, addressing, at a
26 minimum, all of the following:

27 (1) The purpose, rationale, and expected benefits of the
28 redesigned waiver plan.

29 (2) The proposed eligibility criteria for clients and
30 service benefit package to be offered through the redesigned
31 waiver plan. Managed care plans participating in the Statewide
32 Medicaid Managed Care program must provide services under the
33 redesigned waiver plan.

34 (3) A proposed implementation plan and timeline,
35 including, but not limited to, recommendations for number of
36 clients served by the redesigned waiver plan at initial
37 implementation, changes over time, and any per-client benefit
38 caps.

39 (4) The fiscal impact for the implementation year and
40 projections for the next 5 years, determined on an actuarially-
41 sound basis.

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42 (5) An analysis of the availability of services and
43 service providers that would be offered under the redesigned
44 waiver plan and recommendations to increase availability of such
45 services, if necessary.

46 (6) A list of all stakeholders, public and private, who
47 were consulted or contacted in the development of the plan.
