This act shall be known as the "Fish and 18 Wildlife Conservation Commission Regional Representation Act." 19 Section 2. Section 379.102, Florida Statutes, is amended 20 to read: 21 379.102 Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission.-The Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission shall 22 (1)23 consist of seven members who shall be appointed by the Governor, 24 subject to confirmation by the Senate, for staggered terms of 5 25 years.

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(2) The executive director of the Fish and Wildlife 26 27 Conservation Commission shall be the chair of the commission. 28 To ensure statewide representation, one member shall (3) 29 reside full-time within each of the 5 regions established by the 30 commission. The five regions are as follows: 31 1. Northwest Region. 32 2. North Central Region. 33 3. Northeast Region. 34 4. Southwest Region. 35 5. South Region. The remaining two members shall be appointed as at-36 (d) 37 large members, representing the state as a whole. (4) (a) Each regional member must reside full-time within 38 39 the boundaries of his or her respective region at the time of 40 appointment and throughout his or her term of service. 41 (b) The at-large members are not subject to regional 42 residency requirements but must be residents of this state. 43 (5) (a) Members shall serve staggered terms of 5 years. 44 (b) A vacancy occurring during the term of a member shall 45 be filled in the same manner as the original appointment and for 46 the remainder of the unexpired term. 47 (6)(a) The commission is authorized to take all necessary actions to define the geographic boundaries of the five regions. 48 49 The Governor shall ensure compliance with this section (b) 50 when appointing members to the commission.

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51 This act does not affect the current composition of (C) 52 the commission until the expiration of existing terms, except 53 when vacancies occur. 54 (2) Members so appointed shall annually select one <del>of</del> 55 their members as chair. Such chair may be removed at any time 56 for sufficient cause, by the affirmative vote of the majority of 57 the members of the commission. In case the said office of chair becomes vacant by removal or otherwise, the same may be filled 58 59 for the unexpired term at any time by the commission from its 60 members. (7) (3) Commission members shall receive no compensation 61 62 for their services as such, but shall be reimbursed for travel expenses as provided in s. 112.061. 63 64 Section 3. Subsection (1) and paragraph (a) of subsection 65 (2) of section 379.3311, Florida Statutes, are amended to read: 379.3311 Police powers of commission and its agents.-66 67 The commission, the executive director and the (1)68 executive director's assistants designated by her or him, and 69 each commission officer are constituted peace officers with the 70 power to make arrests for violations of the laws of this state when committed in the presence of the officer or when committed 71 on lands under the supervision and management of the commission, 72 the department, the Board of Trustees of the Internal 73 74 Improvement Trust Fund, or the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, including state parks, coastal and aquatic 75 Page 3 of 4

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76 managed areas, and greenways and trails. The general laws 77 applicable to arrests by peace officers of this state shall also 78 be applicable to such director, assistants, and commission 79 officers. Such persons may enter upon any land or waters of the 80 state for performance of their lawful duties and may take with 81 them any necessary equipment, and such entry does not constitute 82 a trespass; however, such persons may not enter upon any private 83 land without a warrant.

84 (2) Such officers may enforce throughout the state all
85 laws relating to game, nongame birds, fish, and fur-bearing
86 animals and all rules and regulations of the commission relating
87 to wild animal life, marine life, and freshwater aquatic life,
88 and in connection with such laws, rules, and regulations, in the
89 enforcement thereof and in the performance of their duties
90 thereunder, to:

91 (a) Go upon all premises, <u>except for private land that</u>
 92 <u>requires such officers to have a warrant</u> <del>posted or otherwise</del>;

Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 2025.

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
