14	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

16	Section 1. This act shall be known as the "Fish and
17	Wildlife Conservation Commission Regional Representation Act."
18	Section 2. Section 379.102, Florida Statutes, is amended
19	to read:
20	379.102 Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission
21	(1) The Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission shall
22	consist of seven members who shall be appointed by the Governor,
23	subject to confirmation by the Senate, for staggered terms of $5$
24	<del>years</del> .
25	(2) Members of the commission so appointed shall annually
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26 select one of their members as chair. The Such chair may be 27 removed at any time for sufficient cause, by the affirmative 28 vote of the majority of the members of the commission. If In 29 case the said office of chair becomes vacant by removal or 30 otherwise, it the same may be filled for the unexpired term at 31 any time by the commission from its members. 32 (3) (a) To ensure statewide representation, one member 33 shall reside full-time within each of the five regions established by the commission. The five regions are as follows: 34 35 1. Northwest Region. 36 2. North Central Region. 37 3. Northeast Region. 38 4. Southwest Region. 39 5. South Region. (b) The remaining two members shall be appointed as at-40 41 large members, representing the state as a whole. 42 (4) (a) Each regional member must reside full-time within 43 the boundaries of his or her respective region at the time of 44 appointment and throughout his or her term of service. 45 The at-large members are not subject to regional (b) 46 residency requirements but must be residents of this state. 47 (5) (a) Members shall serve staggered terms of 3 years. 48 (b) A vacancy occurring during the term of a member shall 49 be filled in the same manner as the original appointment and for the remainder of the unexpired term. 50

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(C) 51 A vacancy may not be filled by a member who resides in 52 the same region as a sitting member. 53 The commission is authorized to take all necessary (6)(a) 54 actions to define the geographic boundaries of the five regions. 55 The Governor shall ensure compliance with this section (b) 56 when appointing members to the commission. 57 (7) (3) Commission members shall receive no compensation 58 for their services as such, but shall be reimbursed for travel 59 expenses as provided in s. 112.061. Section 3. Subsection (1) and paragraph (a) of subsection 60 (2) of section 379.3311, Florida Statutes, are amended to read: 61 379.3311 Police powers of commission and its agents.-62 The commission, the executive director and the 63 (1)64 executive director's assistants designated by her or him, and each commission officer are constituted peace officers with the 65 power to make arrests for violations of the laws of this state 66 67 when committed in the presence of the officer or when committed 68 on lands under the supervision and management of the commission, 69 the department, the Board of Trustees of the Internal 70 Improvement Trust Fund, or the Department of Agriculture and 71 Consumer Services, including state parks, coastal and aquatic 72 managed areas, and greenways and trails. The general laws 73 applicable to arrests by peace officers of this state shall also 74 be applicable to such director, assistants, and commission 75 officers. Such persons may enter upon any land or waters of the

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76 state for performance of their lawful duties and may take with 77 them any necessary equipment, and such entry does not constitute 78 a trespass; however, such persons may not enter upon any private 79 land without a warrant.

80 (2) Such officers may enforce throughout the state all 81 laws relating to game, nongame birds, fish, and fur-bearing 82 animals and all rules and regulations of the commission relating 83 to wild animal life, marine life, and freshwater aquatic life, 84 and in connection with such laws, rules, and regulations, in the 85 enforcement thereof and in the performance of their duties 86 thereunder, to:

(a) Go upon all premises, <u>except for private land that</u> requires such officers to have a warrant <del>posted or otherwise</del>;
