27	or a rule that has the purpose or effect of making payments to a

29	(3) The Attorney General may institute a civil action in
30	circuit court for preliminary or permanent injunctive relief to
31	remedy or prevent a violation of this section. The Attorney
32	General shall issue a cease and desist order to a local
33	government that adopts or enforces an ordinance, a resolution,
