Include a process that enables automatic enrollment of 34 (b) 35 qualified individuals in Medicaid, the Children's Health 36 Insurance Program, or any other state or federal exchange that 37 offers cost-sharing benefits for the purchase of health insurance. By January 1, 2026, the Agency for Health Care 38 Administration shall seek federal approval to require the system 39 40 to also include a process that enables automatic and continuous 41 enrollment for 5 years in Medicaid of qualified individuals who 42 are permanently disabled, without these individuals having to 43 meet the annual redetermination requirement.
