Section 487.082, Florida Statutes, is created 10 11 to read: 12 487.082 Products liability actions.-13 (1) A products liability action under this part, including 14 a failure to warn, may not be brought or maintained against any distributor, dealer, applicator, registrant, or agricultural 15 16 employer, as defined in s. 487.2031, unless: 17 The distributor, dealer, applicator, registrant, or (a) 18 agricultural employer exercised substantial control over the 19 aspect of the design, testing, manufacture, or labeling of the 20 product that caused the alleged harm for which recovery of 21 damages is sought; 22 The distributor, dealer, applicator, registrant, or (b) 23 agricultural employer altered or modified the product, and the 24 alteration or modification was a substantial factor in causing 25 the alleged harm for which recovery of damages is sought;

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26 The distributor, dealer, applicator, registrant, or (C) 27 agricultural employer handled, used, or applied the product in a 28 manner inconsistent with the product label and such action or 29 failure to warn caused the alleged harm for which recovery of 30 damages is sought; or 31 The manufacturer of the product that caused the (d) 32 alleged harm for which recovery of damages is sought is not 33 subject to the jurisdiction of this state. 34 (2) (a) A products liability action under this part based 35 on a failure to warn may not be brought or maintained against a manufacturer for any pesticide registered with the United States 36 37 Environmental Protection Agency Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, 38 and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA), 7 U.S.C. ss. 136 et seq., if the 39 label is: 40 1. Approved by the United States Environmental Protection 41 Agency; 42 2. Consistent with the most recent human health assessment 43 performed under FIFRA; or 44 3. Consistent with the United States Environmental 45 Protection Agency carcinogenicity classification of the 46 pesticide under FIFRA. 47 (b) A label described in paragraph (a) satisfies any 48 requirement for a warning label regarding health or safety, or 49 any other provision of general law. 50 Section 2.
