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26 military experience can be valuable to a target industry or 27 secondary industry business. Such efforts may include attending 28 job fairs and events; hosting events for servicemembers, 29 veterans, and their spouses or the business community; and using 30 digital and social media and direct mail campaigns. The 31 corporation shall also include such marketing as part of its 32 main marketing campaign.

33 <u>2.(b)</u> Assist individuals in the target market who reside 34 in or relocate to this state and who are seeking employment with 35 target industry or secondary industry businesses. The 36 corporation shall offer skills assessments to such individuals 37 and assist them in establishing employment goals and applying 38 for and achieving gainful employment.

39 <u>a.1.</u> Assessment may include skill match information, skill 40 gap analysis, résumé creation, translation of military skills 41 into civilian workforce skills, and translation of military 42 achievements and experience into generally understood civilian 43 workforce skills.

44 <u>b.2</u>. Assistance may include providing the servicemember,
45 veteran, or his or her spouse with information on current
46 workforce demand by industry or geographic region, creating
47 employment goals, and aiding or teaching general knowledge
48 related to completing applications.

49 <u>c.3.</u> Assessment and assistance may be in person or by
 50 electronic means, as determined by the corporation to be most

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51 efficient and best meet the needs of veterans or their spouses. 52 3.(c) Assist Florida target industry and secondary 53 industry businesses in recruiting and hiring individuals in the target market. The corporation shall provide services to Florida 54 55 businesses to meet their hiring needs by connecting businesses with suitable applicants for employment. Suitable applicants 56 57 include veterans or veterans' spouses who have appropriate job 58 skills or may need additional training to meet the specific needs of a business. The corporation shall also provide 59 60 information about the state and federal benefits of hiring 61 veterans.

62 4.(d) Create a grant program to provide funding to assist 63 individuals in the target market in meeting the workforce-skill needs of target industry and secondary industry businesses 64 65 seeking to hire, promote, or generally improve specialized skills of veterans, establish criteria for approval of requests 66 67 for funding, and maximize the use of funding for this program. 68 Grant funds may be used only in the absence of available 69 veteran-specific federally funded programs. Grants may fund 70 specialized training specific to a particular business.

71 <u>a.1.</u> The program may prioritize grant funds to be used to 72 provide a certificate, a license, or nondegree training from the 73 Master Credentials List pursuant to s. 445.004(4)(h); any 74 federally created certifications or licenses; and any skills-75 based industry certifications or licenses deemed relevant or

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76 necessary by the corporation. Funds may be allocated only upon a 77 review that includes, but is not limited to, documentation of 78 accreditation and licensure.

79 <u>b.2.</u> Grant reimbursements are limited to \$5,000 per 80 eligible trainee per fiscal year. Qualified businesses must 81 cover the entire cost for all of the training provided before 82 receiving reimbursement from the corporation. Training costs for 83 a trainee in a fiscal year must be equal to or greater than 84 \$5,000. Eligible costs and expenditures include, but are not 85 limited to:

(I)a. Tuition and fees.

87

(II)b. Books and classroom materials.

(III)c. Rental fees for facilities.

89 <u>c.3</u>. Before funds are allocated for a request pursuant to 90 this section, the corporation shall prepare a grant agreement 91 between the business requesting funds and the corporation. Such 92 agreement must include, but need not be limited to:

93 <u>(I)a.</u> Identification of the personnel necessary to conduct
94 the instructional program, instructional program description,
95 and any vendors used to conduct the instructional program.

96 <u>(II)</u> b. Identification of the duration of the instructional 97 program.

98 <u>(III)</u>e. Identification of all direct, training-related 99 costs.

(IV) d. Identification of special program requirements that

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101 are not otherwise addressed in the agreement.

102 <u>(V)</u>e. Permission to access aggregate information specific 103 to the wages and performance of participants upon the completion 104 of instruction for evaluation purposes. The agreement must 105 specify that any evaluation published subsequent to the 106 instruction may not identify the employer or any individual 107 participant.

108 <u>d.4.</u> A business may receive a grant under any state 109 program and a grant under this section for the same veteran 110 trainee.

e.5. Notwithstanding sub-subparagraph b. subparagraph 2., 111 112 grant funds may be used as educational stipends for individuals 113 in the target market while training at any location of the University of Florida's Institute for Food and Agricultural 114 Sciences within this state. The corporation and the University 115 of Florida shall enter into an agreement before any grant funds 116 117 are expended, and the corporation shall determine the amount and 118 structure of any educational stipend. Such stipend may be used 119 only for such training for a period of no less than 4 months and no more than 6 months, in the absence of veteran-specific 120 121 federally funded programs.

122 <u>5.(e)</u> Contract with one or more entities to administer an 123 entrepreneur initiative program for individuals in the target 124 market in this state which connects business leaders in the 125 state with such individuals seeking to become entrepreneurs.

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<u>a.1.</u> The corporation shall award each contract in
accordance with the competitive bidding requirements in s.
287.057 to one or more public or private entities that:

129 <u>(I)</u>a. Demonstrate the ability to implement the program and 130 the commitment of resources, including financial resources, to 131 such programs.

<u>(II)</u> Have a demonstrated experience working with veteran
 entrepreneurs.

134 <u>(III)</u>e. As determined by the corporation, have been 135 recognized for their performance in assisting entrepreneurs to 136 launch successful businesses in this state.

137 b.2. Each contract must include performance metrics, 138 including a focus on employment and business creation. The entity may also work with a university or college offering 139 140 related programs to refer individuals in the target market or to 141 provide services. The entrepreneur initiative program may 142 include activities and assistance such as peer-to-peer learning 143 sessions, mentoring, technical assistance, business roundtables, 144 networking opportunities, support of student organizations, 145 speaker series, or other tools within a virtual environment.

146 <u>6.(f)</u> Administer a SkillBridge initiative for target 147 industry and secondary industry businesses in this state and for 148 eligible individuals in the target market who reside in, or who 149 wish to reside in, this state. In administering the initiative, 150 the corporation shall:

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151 <u>a.1.</u> Establish and maintain, as applicable, its 152 certification for the SkillBridge initiative or any other 153 similar workforce training and transition programs established 154 by the United States Department of Defense;

155 <u>b.</u>2. Educate businesses, business associations, and 156 eligible individuals in the target market on the SkillBridge 157 initiative and its benefits, and educate military command and 158 personnel within the state on the opportunities available to 159 eligible individuals in the target market;

160 <u>c.3.</u> Assist businesses in obtaining approval for skilled 161 workforce training curricula under the SkillBridge initiative, 162 including, but not limited to, apprenticeships, internships, or 163 fellowships; and

164 <u>d.4.</u> Match eligible individuals in the target market with 165 training opportunities offered by the corporation or 166 participating businesses, with the intent of having them achieve 167 gainful employment in this state upon completion of their 168 SkillBridge training.

187	Section 2. The Legislature finds that it is a public
188	necessity that information pertaining to an individual or
189	organization that seeks assistance, services, or training under
190	s. 295.22(4), Florida Statutes, be made confidential and exempt
191	from public records requirements under s. 119.07(1), Florida
192	Statutes, and s. 24(a), Article I of the State Constitution. The
193	Legislature created Florida Is For Veterans, Inc., and funds the
194	program under s. 295.22(4), Florida Statutes, administered by
195	the corporation, in order to provide assistance, services, and
196	training to separating servicemembers, veterans, and others
197	through organizations such as employers, nonprofits, and
198	universities in the areas of career placement and training and
199	entrepreneurship training to support workforce and economic
200	development within this state. Making information, such as
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201	resumes of job seekers, entrepreneurship business plans, and
202	employer workforce training plans and curricula, publicly
203	available exposes those individuals and organizations to risk of
204	loss of personal privacy and theft of confidential business
205	information. Without the public records exemption, the state
206	would be unable to effectively and efficiently implement and
207	administer the program.
208	Section 3. This act shall take effect on the same date
209	that HB 1241 or similar legislation takes effect, if such
210	legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an
211	extension thereof and becomes a law.

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
