**Section 1. Paragraph (b) of subsection (2) of section
381.00315, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:**

381.00315 Public health advisories; public health
emergencies; isolation and quarantines.—The State Health Officer
is responsible for declaring public health emergencies, issuing
public health advisories, and ordering isolation or quarantines.

(b) Before declaring a public health emergency, the State
Health Officer shall, ~~to the extent possible,~~ consult with the
Governor and shall notify the Chief of Domestic Security. The
declaration of a public health emergency shall continue until

the State Health Officer finds that the threat or danger has been dealt with to the extent that the emergency conditions no longer exist and he or she terminates the declaration. However, a declaration of a public health emergency may not continue for longer than 30 ~~60~~ days after the declaration unless the Governor concurs in the renewal of the declaration. Each renewal shall extend the expiration of the declaration for 30 days. A declaration of a public health emergency automatically terminates if it is not timely renewed before its expiration in accordance with this paragraph. An expired declaration may not be renewed. At any time, the Legislature, by concurrent resolution, may terminate the public health emergency or any related emergency order. If the public health emergency is terminated by the Legislature, the State Health Officer may not declare a substantially similar emergency.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2025.
